BUILDING A BENCHMARK FOR HOPE

The foundation of hope for men in Alberta starts with the Research Program at Calgary's Prostate Cancer Centre. Recognized as one of the top research facilities in Canada, our Research Team selects studies that includes research to understand how cancer develops, and how to better diagnose and treat prostate cancer. Studies also include testing new and emerging treatments to help reduce mortality from prostate cancer.

Through the outcomes and construction of new studies we are creating a positive future for the 1 in 7 men that will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in their lifetime.

APCaRI: Alberta Prostate Cancer Research Initiative

- The APCaRI program compiles data for a large registry and biorepository (blood, semen, urine) of patient lab specimens
- Data has now been collected for over 3,000 patients in Alberta with the Prostate Cancer Centre enrolling over half of these patients
- The registry, which contains detailed patient information allows the researchers to monitor the patterns of care and results of men living with prostate cancer
- The biorepository of specimens collected from patients is being used to develop new tests to better diagnose and predict disease outcomes

A number of ongoing clinical trials provide an opportunity for patients to receive investigational treatments for their prostate cancer.

- The SPARTAN study was conducted for patients who had not developed metastatic disease yet had a rising PSA (Prostate Specific Antigen) despite receiving hormone deprivation therapy
- All patients who had not initially received the study drug had the opportunity to receive it once this benefit became known
- Full details of the benefit of Apalutamide are expected in early 2018

LIFE AFTER
PROSTATE CANCER

For some men after-care is a critical step to sustain a rapid recovery and maintain a healthy life. It is through the construction of our Life After Prostate cancer programs that we are creating a healthier future for men. Programs like Strength & Stretch guide patients through gentle functional fitness, and stretching exercises which are specifically designed for prostate cancer. As our present programs continue to grow, we are assessing the need for additional programs. We will align these programs with the needs of Androgen Deprivation Therapy patients as well as with our research patients.

Support programs for prostate cancer patients:

- Androgen Deprivation Therapy
- Life After Prostate Cancer class
- Strength and Stretch class
- Peer2Peer Prostate Cancer Patient Session
- Nutrition

In 2018, we will be introducing a Brain & Brawn class, which utilizes mind and body to help mitigate anxiety and stress while strengthen muscles.

The MAN VAN™



In order to deliver and maintain the high quality of services the MAN VAN delivers to the community, Calgary's Prostate Cancer Centre has constructed a team of 46 motivated volunteers and 25 clinical staff.

They have also built a solid network of donors, sponsors and partners who help build awareness in the community and keep the MAN VAN on the road.

Prevention of advanced prostate cancer starts with education and the MAN VAN is the vehicle that can raise awareness about this very important cause. Calgary's Prostate Cancer Centre operates two MAN VAN vehicles. These mobile men's health clinics travel throughout Calgary and rural Alberta, providing free baseline PSA (Prostate Specific Antigen) blood testing to men. The Van also hosts the "Know Your Numbers" Men's Health Program, offering blood pressure, blood sugar, and height and weight measurements.

Prostate cancer is the most frequently reported cancer in men and is the cause of death of more than 400 men annually in our province. In its early stages there may be no signs or symptoms, but if detected early it is very treatable. This is why Calgary's Prostate Cancer Centre works hard to ensure all men know the importance of baseline PSA blood testing and their overall health.

Since the MAN VAN program started in 2009, over 36,000 men have visited the Van at one of their 1,000 clinics

CONSTRUCTING A SUCCESSFUL MAN VAN CLINIC

If a MAN VAN clinic were a construction site, Bradley Asselstine, manager of the Alberta Treasury Branch in Lloydminster, would be its foreman. On September 12, 2017, Bradley and his team hosted the most successful clinic in MAN VAN history, in which 106 men received a free baseline PSA blood test.

While Bradley led the charge, he credits the success of the event to his ATB team, local media, and his community.

In ATB's tool belt for the success of the clinic was social media, posters, t-shirts, and most importantly local media. The foundation of the event lay with the community.

He likens the MAN VAN to preventative maintenance for men. "Men do a really great job of looking after equipment and before there is a problem, we do preventative maintenance" Bradley explains, "but we don't look after ourselves unless we have to because something has gone wrong."

In 2017, Prostate Cancer Centre partnered with community groups, municipalities, nonprofit organizations and companies to host 184 MAN VAN clinics throughout Alberta. The Centre is grateful to ATB and all MAN VAN hosts. The partnerships raised awareness about the importance of early prostate cancer detection, encouraged men to become more proactive about their health and constructed hope for the future by keeping families healthy and active.

KNOW YOUR NUMBERS

In 2016, the MAN VAN program constructed a new awareness initiative called "Know Your Numbers." The program creates hope for men by empowering them to take charge of their health and make positive changes to decrease the chances of developing chronic health issues. In 2017, we continued to offer more men's health clinics, providing men with blood sugar, blood pressure, and height and weight measurements.

A NEW SPACE FOR MEN'S HEALTH

This major expansion will become home to two Urologists and an office for Men's Health. The Men's Health clinic is primarily funded through the Women For Men's Health (WFMH) initiative. The WFMH initiative was started by Dr. Shelley Spaner in 2016, its mandate is to engage women to help men improve their health and wellness.



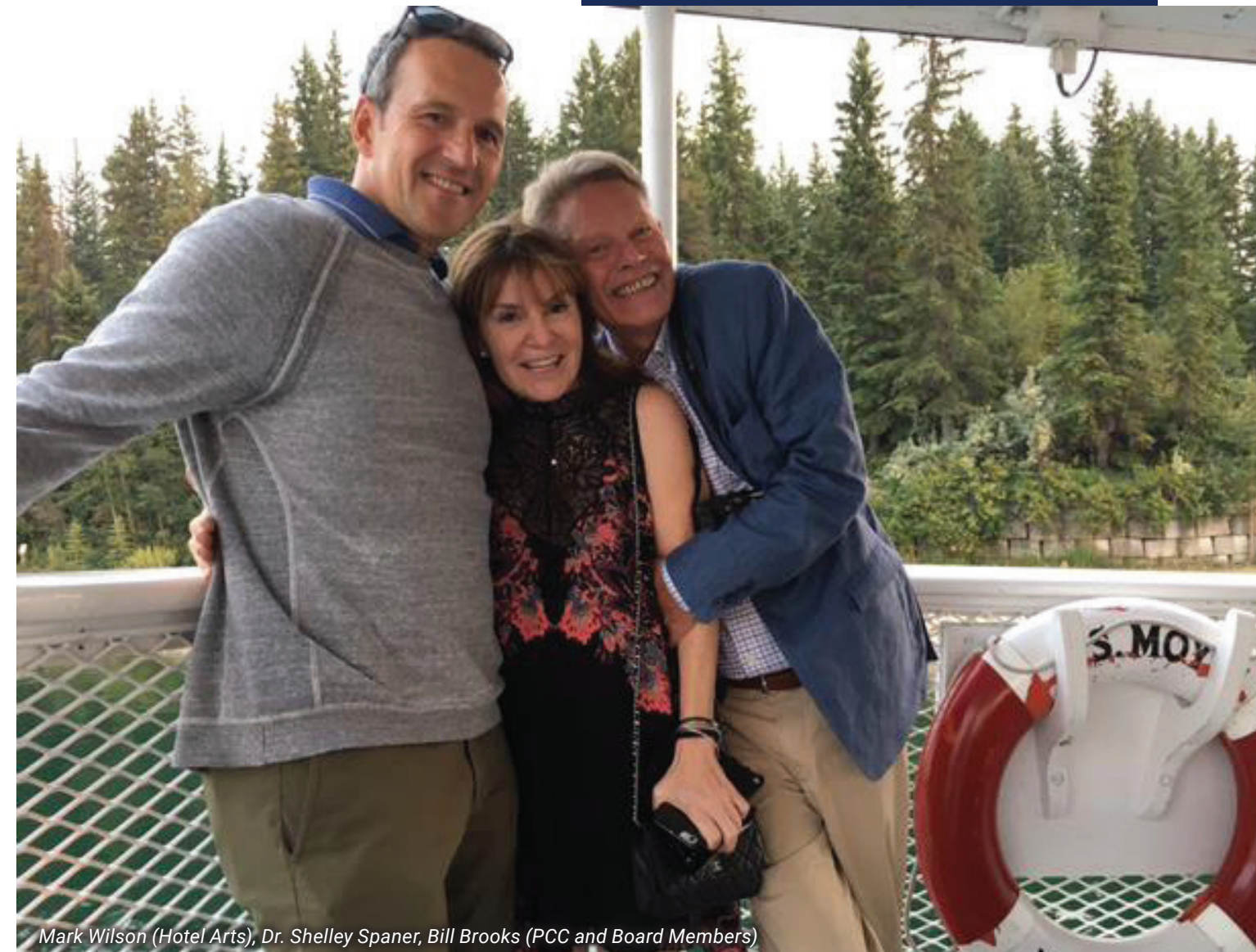

THE IMPORTANCE OF VOLUNTEERS

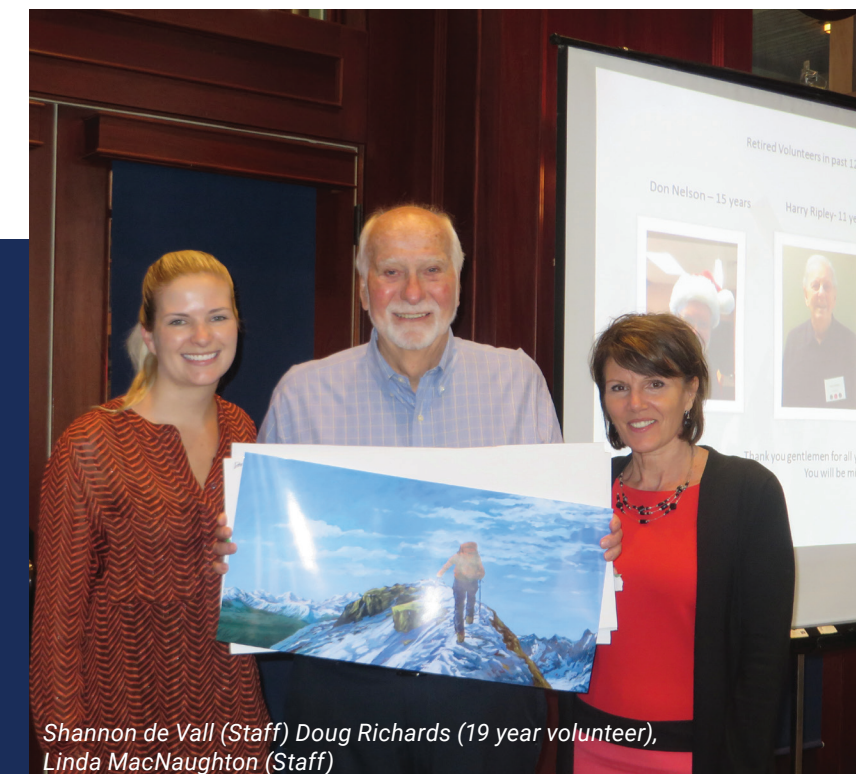

A PASSION FOR VOLUNTEERING

Why do you volunteer?

Ross: I suppose I'm just like most people who find out that they have cancer. It causes a lot of fear. It causes you to examine your thoughts about the future and what that future might bring. I found comfort through my treatment at the PCC. Each of the specialists that performed my initial exam, my biopsy and my cancer treatment were kind and informative, easing my mind throughout the entire process.

All of my experiences were in an atmosphere of support, kindness and generosity from everyone involved. I wanted to give back and contribute in some way to make the process as non-fearful as possible for others.

Rick: I volunteer because of the way I experienced the whole process within Calgary's Prostate Cancer Centre. Being referred to the facility is a scary scenario to begin with; I was quickly put at ease by being met at the entrance by a volunteer who helped guide me through the process and was more than willing to answer my questions. I was so impressed with everyone that I became involved with from the reception, the Radiologist and their assistants to the Urologist and all of the follow up visits that I required. I said when I retire this is where I want to volunteer.

What is your favorite part of the volunteer experience?

Ross: My favorite part of the experience is in the conversations I have with men and their families.

Many of the patients are very nervous especially prior to the biopsy as they don't understand the process. My challenge is to try to ease their minds by letting them know it's probably not going to be as difficult as they imagine and to try to clarify the process.

Rick: My best experiences have been when someone thanks me for providing either information or compassion after their experience at the PCC. And, I really like when I get thanked for volunteering my time.

What advice do you have for men going through prostate cancer?

Ross: Know that having prostate cancer is not the end of the world if it is detected early. Lean on your friends, medical experts and survivors in deciding how to proceed. It may change your life somewhat but you can still lead a vibrant, fulfilling life with strong personal relationships.

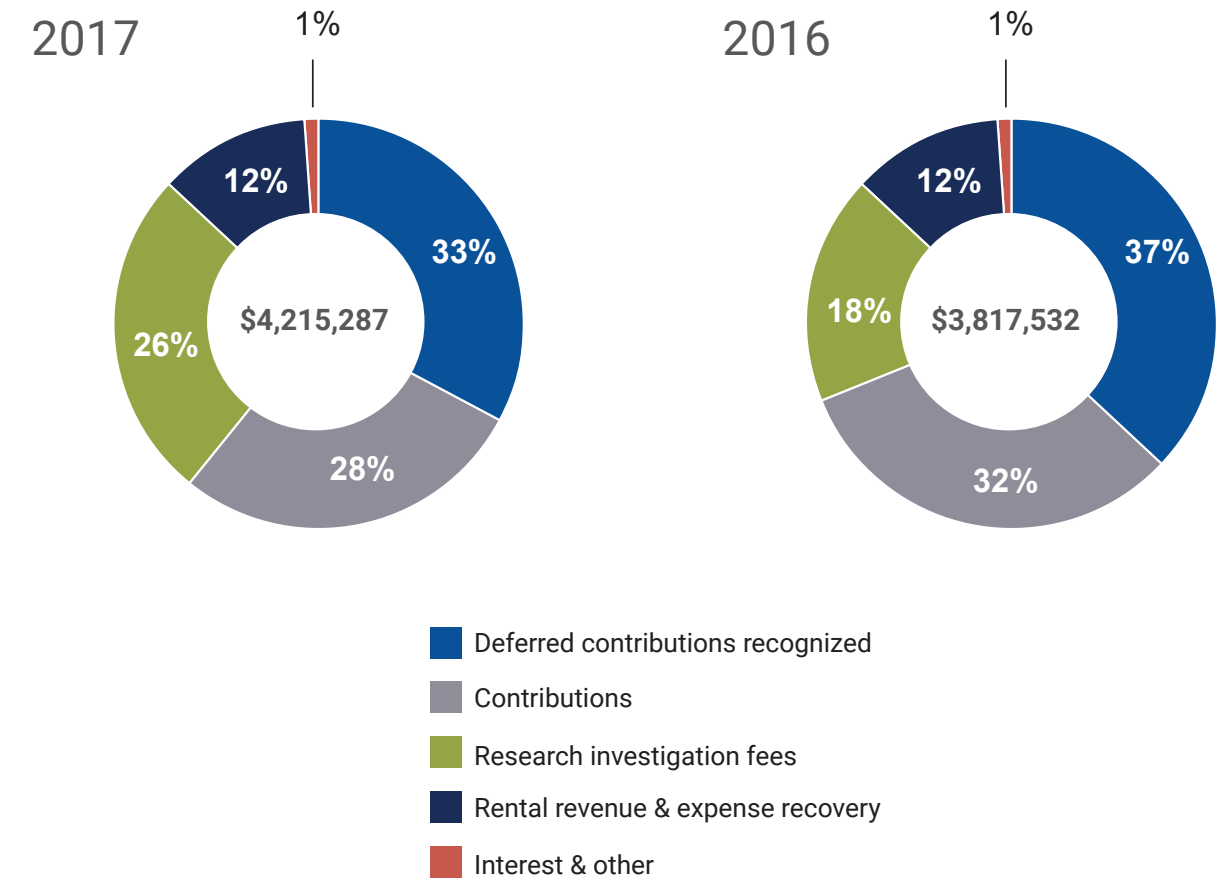

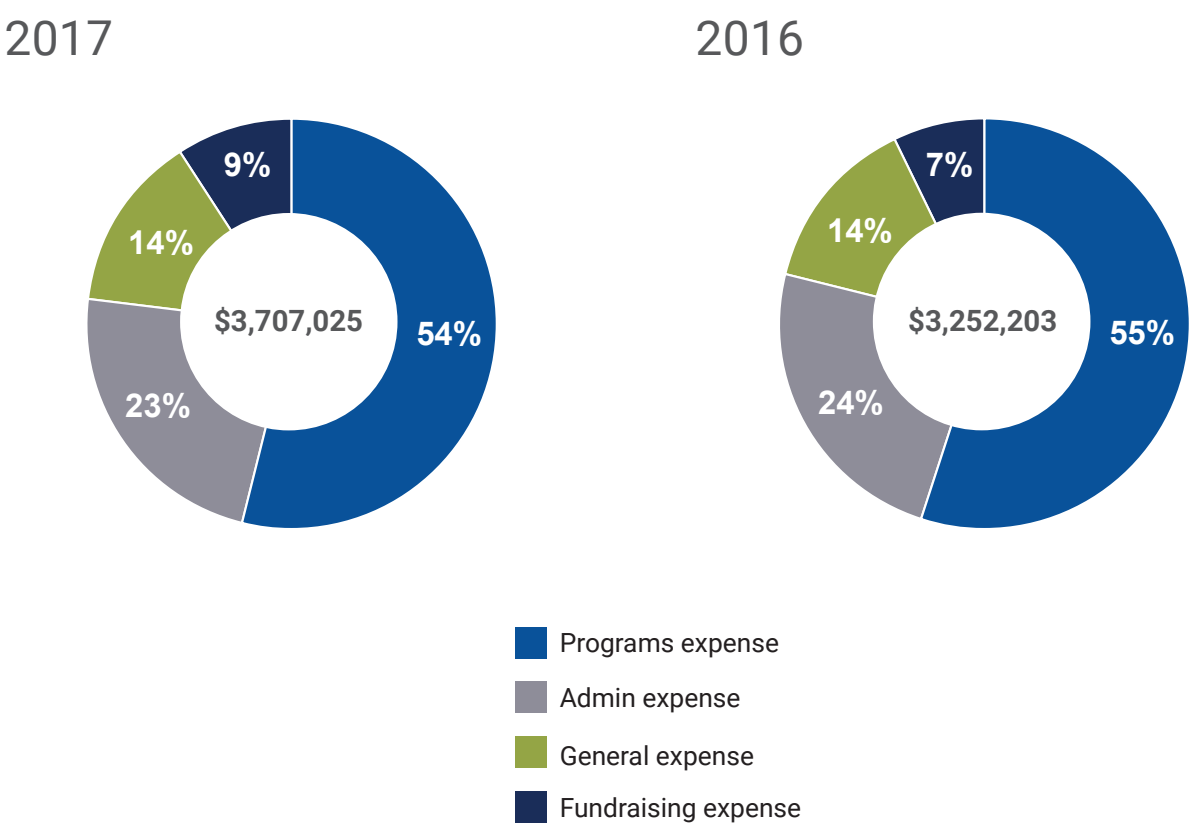
